Numbers 6:22-27 In three succinct phrases, this ancient formula expresses the context in which God's people live. We are under the personal care of God. He gives us his gracious gifts and looks on us with affection and care. God will oversee our lives and fulfil them. That word 'peace' speaks of enjoying the full abundance of life. Indeed, the blessing extends to carrying God's name like a surname. We are part of his family.

Psalm 8 There is a particular majesty in the way in which God brings together the vastness and wonder of his created universe with his intimate involvement in the human project. That combination shows itself through God's careful involvement with every aspect of creation. He is concerned with the glory of the heavens as with the babblings of a baby. He does not just care for humanity. He elevates us, next to himself. It is above all God's entering our state, which we celebrate at Christmas, that raises us.

Galatians 4:4-7 Paul speaks of how the coming of Jesus Christ, God's son, born of a woman, a Jewish boy, has transformed our relationship with God. He uses the picture of adoption to show how we have been moved from the situation of a slave to that of a privileged child, expectant of all the riches of inheritance, able to speak to God with intimacy, as to a parent.

Luke 2:15-21 Only when the shepherds follow up the heavenly vision and go to see for themselves can they find confirmation of the sign of which they had been told. Sharing what they have seen and heard, they praise and glorify God. As Mary treasures these things, Jesus is circumcised and named in accordance with the law. There is much for us to ponder in these words.

Pointers for Prayer

- Pray for those who have not yet found the reality of the personal love which God offers them;
- Meditate on how we benefit from living under the blessing of God:
- Ponder and treasure the whole richness of God's care for each
 of us against the scale and wonder of his creation. Then let's
 praise him.
