Our readings this week

On the Sundays between Epiphany and Lent, many of our readings will focus on the Sermon on the Mount and the start of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians.

Isaiah 58: 1-9 What God wants from his people is not an outward show of piety that is not matched by our deeds. He wants us to show our devotion in the way that we live, through working for social justice and bringing practical help to the needy. Then we will shine like beacons to the world, and we will find that God is supporting us and that we can count on his help in all we do.

Psalm 112: 1-9 The person who orders and conducts her life in practical obedience to God will experience great reward. For some this may come in material success. But the main measure of success for the psalmist is not in material success: it is in being secure in the Lord.

1 Corinthians 2: 1-12 What Paul has been teaching to the Corinthian church is not "human wisdom". Rather, he is calling them to something much more dramatic: to open themselves to God's wisdom, made known to us through the working of his Spirit. That wisdom is seen displayed in Jesus Christ crucified - a vision that is far from the understanding of the wise guys of our time.

Matthew 5: 13-20 The Sermon on the Mount is Jesus' guidebook for a church that is on the march. We are called to be salt and light to the world, enriching it, illuminating reality. If we fail in this, we are of no use. The key is not to drop our standards to reflect the ways of the world but to live, with God's help, to the highest standards of obedience to him.

Pointers for prayer

- The world judges us by what we do. The practice of justice speaks volumes;
- The first step in helping others is to be concerned for them. We can show that concern by bringing their needs to God in prayer;
- Pray that we and the whole church may be attentive and responsive to God's word for us.
