Malachi 3:1-4 This is a warning to the religious people, perhaps in particular to religious leaders (hence the Levites), who "go through the motions". When God's messenger comes (which he will do suddenly and unexpectedly), he will sort things out in a way that some may find painful, so that real worship will be offered to God.

Benedictus (Luke 1:68-79) This beautiful song is uttered by Zechariah after the miraculous birth of John the Baptist. It has always had a special place in Christian worship, as we make Zechariah's prophetic insights our own. It praises God for fulfilling the ancient promise of redemption in a way that will reach out in mercy to all God's people, a work that is even then beginning. It also points to the role of God's partner(s) in bringing this good news before his people.

Luke 3:1-6 John's is a prophetic voice, for he has received the "word of the Lord". Luke is concerned to show that his prophecy began at a certain point in time and that it was the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecy of one who would prepare the way for God's redemption of his people. Look at how widely the gospel is to be spread – it is for everyone and John is to prepare the high road for his people to be gathered in.

Pointers for prayer

- Pray for the witness of the church to be genuine and active, so that it may be pleasing to God;
- What obstacles need to be removed if all those living in darkness and the shadow of death are to be gathered in to God?
- We are all called to be God's partners in the work of the gospel. In what ways might I help?
- Give thanks to God for the privilege of worshipping him without fear.

The Covid situation in Brussels remains serious. Following the announcement by the Belgian government yesterday evening, we can report that for now nothing will change for us at Holy Trinity Brussels. However, we would like to ask you to remain diligent in booking for services through ChurchSuite or through the church calendar on our website: holytrinity.be/churchsuite-calendar. If you need any help, please email admin@holytrinity.be or call us. With a busy December month ahead of us, we would be very sorry if we had to turn people away at the door because we were full. Many thanks for your cooperation!

The following measures are in place to keep us COVID-safe in church:

- * Keep 1,5m distance at all times.
- * Use the alcohol gel when you enter church.
- * Masks are obligatory for everyone over 6 years of age.
- * Soft singing is allowed beneath masks.

'Hybrid worship' (following and participating in the service in church and online) will continue for Sunday services at 10:30, 14:00 and 18:00.
