Sunday School groups meet in church. Contact our Children's and Youth worker <u>Anna</u> <u>Zödi</u> for more details about children's and youth activities. **Micah 5:2-**5a Beyond the impending threat of exile, Micah sees God's salvation working out for his people. A new ruler will be born, not in David's great city, but in the town of David's birth, one who is new, yet whose origins are ancient. His rule will not be like that of an earthly tyrant. It will be a rule of security, a rule in the name of the Lord. His rule will bring peace.

Psalm 80 Israel cries out to the God whom they have known as their shepherd, but whose anger they now feel. They long for the sense that his face is shining upon them again. With God, Israel flourishes, but without him, they are like an abandoned vineyard. *Come and save us*! is their cry of repentance and is the cry of all who are in trouble.

Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55) Mary's great poem of praise merits continued reflection. That is why we use it in Christian worship. Mary recognises that the God of mighty works is the God of reversals. Those content in their self-sufficiency find themselves humbled, while the lowly servant is exalted. He is the One who has never forgotten, nor will ever forget, his humble people down the ages.

Luke 1:39-45 The gospel tells the story of the visit of Mary to Elizabeth. The two mothers-to-be, recipients of God's grace, instruments of his work, meet and rejoice. Elizabeth could see what ordinary people could not see: that Mary's child was of God. Mary, unlike Zechariah, believed the angel that had come to her and is blessed for it. Even the unborn child of Elizabeth, a child who is to do God's work, recognises something of the wonder that is in the making.

Pointers for prayer

- God loves the humble, those who hunger for his good things, his servants. Am I secure in my own strength, or do I trust in God?
- Pray that when God does new things, we may be open enough to him to recognise and to receive his gifts;
- Pray for our rulers, for the rich, for those who exercise power, for those who are tempted to pride, to be open to the power of God.

The following measures are in place to keep us COVID-safe in church:
