19:30 A Service to Remember Those who have Died

Daniel 7:1-3, 15-18 Daniel sees the seemingly invincible powers of the world from the viewpoint of the court of heaven. Four terrifying kings arise from chaos of the earth, but the heavenly viewpoint puts them in perspective. The kingdom will not go to them, but to God's holy ones, who will possess it forever.

Psalm 149 The psalmist well understands God's way towards those who keep faith with him. As the humble receive victory and the faithful exult in glory, those who threatened and abused them find that their power has vanished. We are invited to join in this great song of praise to the God who redeems his faithful people.

Ephesians 1:11-23 Christian believers are God's own people, living as a community of saints in the church. We know this because we are marked with the Holy Spirit, God present in our midst. Christ is the head, the church his body. God has given Christ authority over all things, including all hostile power. Therefore we have nothing to fear. This is the hope in which Christians live: a rich and glorious inheritance of redemption for us all, demonstrated in God's raising of Jesus from the dead.

Luke 6:20-31 We are given a twofold picture. The beatitudes portray "God's people on the march". They may suffer all sorts of deprivation now in service to Christ. In this, they like the prophets of old. But their situation will be reversed in the kingdom of God. The woes warn those who prosper now. Their situation will also be reversed. Jesus calls his people to show the kingdom values of love and forgiveness, doing to others as we would have them do to us. Jesus did this on the cross. It is the pattern of the path to glory.

Pointers for prayer

- Pray for all who suffer under the abuse of human power to know that such arrogance will be overwhelmed by the power that raised Jesus from the dead;
- Are we among God's people, on the march towards his kingdom? If so, do we show the kingdom values?
- God wonderful salvation of those who trust him calls for our praise.

A note from the Treasurer about energy costs. Our energy supplier has raised our monthly contribution from €736 to €2,011 starting in November. Gas accounts for 75% of the charge and should help us to understand the Council decision to reduce the heating in church from 19°C to 15.5°C. We trust that this move will soften the blow and keep the actual charge below the estimate of the energy supplier.
