Our readings this week

Job 29:11-16 Job discourses on how the life of virtue meets the needs of the weak. The categories are conventional, but they are still real. The poor, the orphan, the wretched, the widow are those with noone to provide for them. Virtue stands for righteousness and justice, strength for those without it, a champion for those alone. Virtue acts like a caring father.

Psalm 112 Will those who do right be rewarded? This poet thinks so. But their blessing is in their character – gracious, merciful and upright – rather than in their material possessions. Further, their sense of security is not because trouble never comes but because they are secure in the Lord. Unlike the selfish desires of the ungodly, righteousness, justice and generosity are qualities that survive.

Acts 11:19-30 As so often in the history of the church, persecution seems to have opened new doors. The Christian message moved on from Jerusalem to Greek-speaking Jews and now to Gentile Greeks in the great city of Antioch. Barnabas, sent to see what is going on, recognises the grace of God at work. His stroke of genius is to bring Paul/Saul to help him with the work. This provides Barnabas and Paul with an opportunity to demonstrate the love of the Antioch Christians for the needy in Jerusalem

John 15:12-17 In giving his disciples the command to love one another, Jesus does so as to friends, those with whom he has shared everything. Now, as to friends, he reminds them that they are called to go and bear fruit. In doing so, any who ask in Jesus' name will find support through the gifts of the Father. So the disciples intimacy with Jesus leads to a closeness to the Father: and because they are all disciples, they are to live in love one with another.

Pointers for prayer

- Reflect on the wide range of actions which enable us to share the love of God. Where can I best be involved?
- Pray for all those who are involved in ministering to those in need;
- Give thanks for all those who have lived the life of love and have found their reward in doing so.
