Preacher: Jacob Quick Leader: Annie Bolger On the Sunday when we celebrate Christ the King, we have four pictures of our king from the Bible. At first sight, they might seem very different.

Jeremiah 23:1-6 The leaders of Israel are described as "shepherds". Far from caring for their flock, the shepherds of Jeremiah's day have scattered them. God promises to gather his flock so that not one will be lost, to give them shepherds who care and a king whose rule will be righteous. For Israel, that means from the line of David.

Psalm 46 This psalm expresses great confidence in God, who protects his people against the chaos of disaster and conflict. It is to God that his people can turn for ever-present help, for he is truly with his people and the streams of his Spirit flow out to them. From clamour we move to stillness, the joyful confidence that finds a true place among Christians.

Colossians 1:11-20 God has brought us into his kingdom by the work of his son. Verses 15-20 are a great hymn to Christ, who he is and what he has done. It is by him and for him that all things have been created. He holds all things together and is the head of the church. Look at his relationship with God (the Father) and at the explanation of what happened on the cross.

Luke 23:33-43 Jesus suffers a criminal's death, to sneering and mockery from religious and civil leaders, the soldiery and even a condemned criminal, while the people look on. Yet an ironical notice correctly identifies him, while one dying criminal seems to grasp who he is. This is our king.

Pointers for prayer

- Leaders bear a great responsibility. We need to pray for them, not just complain about them;
- The Lord of creation, the head of the church, the firstborn from the dead, the image of God that we can see and hear, reconciler of all things, peacemaker;
- He is with us in all our needs; do we ask for his help?
- Before our suffering Lord, raised on a cross for us, we need to be still and think on this amazing love.

A note from the Treasurer about energy costs. Our energy supplier has raised our monthly contribution from €736 to €2,011 starting in November. Gas accounts for 75% of the charge and should help us to understand the Council decision to reduce the heating in church from 19°C to 15.5°C. We trust that this move will soften the blow and keep the actual charge below the estimate of the energy supplier.

Today is also Safeguarding Sunday We are a church that takes the needs of the most vulnerable among us to heart; for this reason we are alert to, and offer training about, safeguarding. This is an easy procedure but with a big impact because it can change our perception and eventually help people in need – *Birte Day, our Safeguarding Officer*.
