### Our readings this week

Acts 7:55-end Stephen's vision of the risen Lord is far from welcome to his assailants. Yet his affirmation of what he saw had enormous consequences that no-one present could foresee. For this martyrdom, which seems like a decisive repudiation of the gospel by a great block of the community of Judaism, leads to its spreading to the Gentiles. For Paul was present at these events and enormous changes were to follow for him.

**Psalm 31:1-5, 15-16** The psalmist is assailed by the pains and woes of life and laments his plight. But in his lament, we see his readiness to take his problem to God, in whom he places all his trust. His prayer is that God's face may shine on him and save him, even as he is confronted by his persecutors. His conviction is that those who bring their cry before God will find it turning into a song of praise. In his hour of greatest need, Stephen was to show the reality of which this psalm spoke.

**1 Peter 2:2-10** Peter exhorts the believers to feed on true spiritual nourishment, so as to grow towards maturity. The community of believers is built on the risen Lord. While the unbeliever stumbles over the risen Lord, to the new community of believers he is the foundation of a wholly new spiritual edifice, in which the new community inherits God's promises to Israel.

John 14:1-14 The resurrection is not just something that happened to Jesus. By his words and his works, Jesus has opened for us the way to God and in doing so, has opened up not just life after death, but life that starts here and now. The resurrection happened for us. From now on, we have access to God through Christ and the actions of the community of believers will continue his work, with his support.

#### Pointers for prayer

- Jesus tells his disciples not to let their hearts be troubled. Pray for all who are in distress to find God's mercy and peace;
- Pray for those who stumble before the risen Lord;
- Stephen forgives his persecutors, showing the love of Jesus. We must do the same.
- To know the shepherd's voice, we need to build the habit of listening.
