Jeremiah 31:27-34 Gardeners are cutting back after the summer, rooting out plants that have failed, digging over the ground with a view to new planting. Jeremiah uses the picture of a vineyard whose sour grapes must be dug out and replanted. But now he looks forward to a crop that will flourish. God's covenant promise to us is to raise a people who know him, respond to him and live joyfully in that relationship.

Psalm 119:97-104 This long psalm is a beautiful meditation on God's law and on the joy and fulfillment known by those who live by it. The law is much more than a series of rules. Rather it is a way of life, a close and trusting relationship with God, an openness to his revelation of himself that brings true wisdom, a path that brings true sweetness of life, for it brings the joy of closeness to God.

2 Timothy 3:14-4:5 Paul's charge to Timothy is impressive and demanding. Where will he find the guidance to fulfill such expectations? Paul points him to scripture. He is speaking of the Hebrew scriptures, but we can understand this as encompassing the whole of scripture, the great resource which God has put at our disposal.

Luke 18:1-8 However good the Pharisee may be, he seems to be praying to himself, not to God. And he is full of contempt for others. However bad the tax collector, he opens his heart to God with a straight plea for mercy. The effectiveness of prayer does not depend on how righteousness we feel, but on God's gracious willingness to listen. We are to pray always, Luke tells us, and not to lose heart.

Pointers for prayer

- Before God, there is no space for vanity. We are like all the others who call on him: sinners depending on his grace alone;
- We need to pray to God, not to talk to ourselves As we do so we can directly tell him of our pains, our needs and our failures; and we can ask his help, for ourselves and others.
- We should also praise him for the blessings his care brings to us.
