Our readings this week

Isaiah 49:1-7 We see our role in God's scheme from a very short-term perspective. But the servant realizes how long God has been preparing their partnership. He is called to be part of something that far surpasses his own sense of significance. Alone, he could achieve nothing. But in partnership with God his achievements will far exceed anything he can imagine. More, they will last forever.

Psalm 40 The psalmist begins with the joyful statement of someone who suddenly finds himself set free. Now he needs a new song to proclaim the saving acts of God and to promise a life that responds. But this is followed by a lament over his troubles. Is the psalm the wrong way round? Or does the psalmist understand that one day we are rejoicing, the next we are in trouble again and that the only solution to this human situation lies in patient trust in the Lord.

1 Cor 1:1-9 Paul and every member of the church are special, called by God. They benefit from the rich provision God makes for his servants through Jesus, the servant of all. That is why Paul can open his letter to the church at Corinth by addressing them as sanctified and called to be holy and can insist that they lack no spiritual gift that is necessary to keep them that way. They can trust God to be faithful in this.

John 1:29-42 It is always important to see the potential of others. John looks on Jesus and sees him as the Lamb of God, a picture that points to the Passover sacrifice and to Jesus' role in resolving the problem of sin. He also sees that God's Spirit rests upon him. This sets off a chain: Andrew also sees something special in Jesus and passes the message on to Simon. Jesus in turn sees the potential in Simon and gives him a new name that expresses that potential.

Pointers for prayer

- The time to bring our troubles to God is always now;
- Ask God for help to see the potential in others;
- Pray for all God's servants, formed and called for his purpose.
