Isaiah 9 1-4 The prophet announces that the injustices and disasters that have struck Israel will be reversed following the birth of a new king. The prophecy may have been concerned with lands lost to Assyria, but Christians hear a message of hope to all for whom the world seems dark. God is at work. The light of his dawn is breaking forth. It is the oppressors who face a crisis.

Psalm 27 The psalm is about trusting the Lord. With the Lord as my stronghold, my light and salvation, of whom should I be afraid? Certainly not of hostile men or women. They may seem terrifying, as they come on in legions. But before God, they are nothing. His people can have confidence, however rough the going, whatever tricks our enemies play, whatever threats they utter. Only one thing matters: the presence of God himself.

1 Corinthians 1 10-18 Division is evidently a problem in the Corinthian church, with different groups claiming loyalty to one or other leader – including Paul. But it is Christ who is our leader, Christ in whose name we are baptized and, above all, Christ who by his cross has won salvation for us. It is the presentation of the cross of Christ to which the church is called and on which the preaching of the gospel is focused.

Matthew 4 12-23 Beginning his ministry, Jesus proclaims that God's kingdom is at hand. In this, the evangelist sees Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled. Jesus begins in concrete manner, calling four ordinary fishermen to follow him. His call continues to come to his people until this day. What was special about these four was that they responded, leading to extraordinary results.

Pointers for prayer

- Pray for all those for whom the world seems dark, that they may glimpse the dawning light of Christ;
- Pray for God's church to focus on the right issues, avoiding the distractions of faction and party, so that God's saving work in Christ may be clearly and faithfully presented to the world;
- The psalmist reminds us that we can trust God. With him on our side, we can approach life with confidence.
