Our readings this week

Leviticus 19:1, 2, 15-18 God demands of his people that they be holy. This turns out to be something very practical, all about the way we treat other people. God makes it clear that cheating, mistreating, and hating people is unacceptable. We must treat others with the high value that belongs to God's children. To be holy includes loving our neighbours as ourselves.

Psalm 1 The godly life is much about where someone puts themselves, the company they choose – where they walk, stand or sit. Those who opt for God will flourish, never short of sustenance, fruitful and productive. The ungodly are nothing. They will blow away and be gone. It is those who stand, sit and walk in the way of God who will know what it is to be blessed.

1 Thessalonians 2:1-8 Paul had a very rough time in Philippi and faced serious opposition in Thessalonica. But he treats his preaching almost like a boxer would treat getting some knocks: you have to be willing to take them. Despite this, his conduct towards the Thessalonians was marked by gentle care, as of a nurse towards the child in her care. His object was to behave in a way pleasing to God.

Matthew 22:34-end The Pharisees seem to want to trap Jesus into identifying himself as unorthodox. We can be grateful for their question, for it leads Jesus to summarise the law by calling on two well-know Old Testament verses. By putting them together, he shows how the love of God depends on the way we love others – and vice versa. Jesus then shows the Pharisees that they have not grasped that the Messiah they await should be greater than David. They have ruled out the divine.

Pointers for prayer

- God says to each of us Be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy. What could 'being holy' mean for me?
- Absorbing God's word is the often unseen work of a lifetime.
 How seriously am I taking it?
- The high calling of all ministers of the gospel is to serve God's people. It is not an easy calling and deserves the support of our prayers.

A note from the Treasurer As we move towards the final quarter of the year, I would like to give you an update on the state of our finances. Our cost budget this year is €1,035 per day. With Paul's departure and other cost savings, our costs are expected to be about €992 per day. Your giving, for which we are very grateful, amounts to €818 per day. We have found other sources of income which add another €160 per day to make a total income of €978 per day. This leaves a shortfall of €14 per day which may not sound much but over the course of the year its over €5,100. The challenge for us is to bridge this gap. Can we do it?
