**Deuteronomy 26:1-11** All the good things that we have come to us from God. The practice of Israel was therefore to take the first fruits of the land (the land is God's gift to his people) and to sacrifice them to him, recalling as they did so the mighty works by which God had brought Israel from insignificance, through slavery in Egypt, to the land of freedom and well-being.

**Psalm 100** This psalm evokes God's people in majestic procession to festal worship. It calls on the whole world to join in that procession, for God is the maker of all. We owe him praise, not out of duty, but out of joy. For our God is not indifferent to his creation but loves it with an everlasting love.

**Philippians 4:4-9** Paul's theme, as he brings this letter to a close, is "standing firm": standing firm in a mood of rejoicing, of gentleness and in the peace of God. The key to peace is that the Lord is near. We can bring our needs before him in prayer. By focusing our minds on the truly good things of life, and our activity on the good practices of the Christian life, we will open our lives to him and to his peace.

**John 6:25-35** This discussion follows on the feeding of the five thousand. Jesus' pressing call to the crowd is to believe in him as sent by God, not just as a wonder worker. Jesus tries to raise the sights of the crowd above their stomachs, to the way that God will feed those who believe in him. Believers, he says, will find their needs met for eternity. Many scholars would see this passage pointing to the Eucharist.

### Pointers for prayer

- •There is no more appropriate time to pray for those in need than when we give thanks for the generous gifts God has given to us;
- •If we are to be able to stand firm in the good gifts of God to his people, we must pray about our own lives;
- •Our Eucharist should be a thanksgiving to God, an expression of our belief in Jesus.

**Harvest at Holy Trinity – today!** Here are two ways to express gratitude and generosity this Harvest!

- •Harvest Sunday. Food donations will be gratefully received at every service today. Fresh vegetables (no fruit, please) will be donated to the Community Kitchen. The Community Kitchen especially requests fresh red peppers, courgettes, aubergine, onions, potatoes, carrots, etc. Non-perishable foods, dry/tinned items, etc, will be shared with the Protestant Social Centre.

Starting from October, HTB and Christian Climate Action will be offering a 'Deep Waters' course. This is an 8-week programme which provides a faith-based framework for exploring issues of anxiety, fear and grief linked to the climate and environmental crisis. Deep Waters supports reflection and conversation with others trying to make sense of climate grief and eco-anxiety through eyes of faith. The journey takes us through themes including lament, truth, wisdom, mortality and justice, in pursuit of renewed hope. The course will run on Tuesday evenings from 4th October, with a mix of 'live' meetings (at HTB) and online sessions.
