Job 42:1-6, 10-17 After long debate about how it is possible that a loving God can allow suffering, Job has encountered God himself. That changes everything. Job recognises that it is simply beyond him to understand God. To behold God is quite different from talking about God. Job humbles himself. The book ends up with Job living happily to a great age. What has happened across the book is that Job has glimpsed something of God's true majesty. That has made all the difference.

Psalm 34:1-8, 19-22 These verses are full of insight and of words that well repay memorisation. But what leads the psalmist to particular exultation is God's concern for his servants. We can ask and receive an answer; we can cry out and be heard. God is near us, watching us and caring for us. He redeems his servant's life.

Hebrews 7:23-end The point is that, while one good person or another might help us for a time, only Jesus is capable of bringing us into a permanent reconciliation, a lasting relationship, with God. Jesus' self-sacrifice was a once-and-for-all act of restoration, achieving what the prophets had foretold.

Mark 10:46-end As Jesus goes up to his death in Jerusalem, he enacts one step in the restoration of the lost children of Israel. Bartimaeus receives the sight that he longs for. But this is not just ordinary sight. His eyes are opened in a spiritual sense, too. He really sees and understands himself and the world for the first time and recognises Jesus for who he is. He decides to follow him. Not only can Jesus do this for Bartimaeus, but he can also do it for you or me.

Pointers for prayer

- Think of all those men and women who are facing suffering of any sort. Pray for them to know God's presence and to experience his redemption;
- Do I really want to be able to ask to see, as Bartimaeus did?
 He was persistent in his efforts to come close to Jesus.
- It is when we recall that once-for-all act that reconciled us to God, that we can lay our problems before him with assurance. Whatever the problem, God is listening.
