Lent 1 26 February 2023

Our readings this week

Our Lent readings have a penitential theme. They show how the first Adam failed, but Jesus, the second Adam, triumphs. Paul saw why that mattered.

Genesis 2 15-17; 3 1-7 The story of Adam and Eve reminds us how human wilfulness loses the riches of God's gifts. Whether that wilfulness is a sign of a character that is fatally flawed, or of human immaturity, (more than one view is possible) we notice how sin leads to a loss of freedom and to the undermining of relationships - in particular estrangement from God and the emergence of mistrust between men and women. Sin, whatever people may say, destroys life.

Psalm 32 The psalmist tells the story of the other readings in a different way. The life that has experienced forgiveness is truly blessed, for unacknowledged sin is a crushing burden. But he has learned from experience that the sin declared becomes the sin forgiven. Relationship with God is rediscovered, for only human sin stood in its way. Trust finds itself surrounded by love, with true cause to rejoice and to be glad.

Romans 5 12-19 If sin brought death to humanity, God's generosity in Jesus reaches far beyond that loss. His gift of overflowing grace brings us life: indeed, life in which we reign. It is before such a loving gift, which deals unilaterally with all the problems caused by human failure, that we are called to penitence.

Matthew 4 1-11 It is often in the desert times that temptation takes us. Only three verses after the voice from heaven said This is my Son, the tempter says If you are the Son... With the help of scripture, properly used, Jesus triumphs. His faith puts God at the centre, trusts him rather than testing him, making him the complete focus of his worship.

Points for prayer

- When we feel we are in the desert, we must be prepared to fight temptation;
- Whatever burdens I carry should be laid openly before God;
- Pray that all those who feel God's hand heavy upon them will find the joy of forgiveness.
- Give thanks to God for his overflowing grace in Jesus.

A note from the Treasurer. It's probably surprising to learn that it costs over $\leq 1,000$ per day to run Holy Trinity. The majority of our income comes from the gifts and donations made to The Friends of Holy Trinity via our bank account BE67 1030 7048 2187. This is the most cost-effective way to give to the church as each transaction costs typically 4 cents. This means that the church receives ≤ 99.96 for each donation of ≤ 100 . It would still be reasonable at ≤ 99.93 by Payconiq but SumUp would give us ≤ 98 , Stripe ≤ 96 and Givt ≤ 93 for each ≤ 100 donated. Cash would be expected to net ≤ 99.70 for each ≤ 100 donated due to the time required to count and bank the cash and the risk of loss or theft. Therefore, we encourage standing orders via the bank. The budget for this year shows a shortfall of $\leq 27,500$ in income to meet the expected expenses. Therefore, I am asking everyone to prayerfully consider their giving to see if there is room to increase the amount given to the church despite the increase in costs that we all face in our daily lives.
