Our readings this week

The theme for the second Sunday in Lent is the importance of responding to God in faith.

Genesis 12 1-4a God calls Abram, at an advanced age, to set out on a journey whose goal is only vaguely stated but carries a seemingly impossible promise of blessing. Abram can do nothing, or he can respond in faith. If he had done nothing, he would quickly have been forgotten. Because he responded in faith, the promised blessing has been delivered in its entirety.

Psalm 121 The psalmist knows only one reliable source of help: God, the creator of all things, who never misses the moment of danger, but watches over us by day and night. This pilgrim faith comes from a lifetime's experience of trusting the God who cares and who can act, who is watching us, who is actively keeping us.

Romans 4 1-5, 13-17 What made Abraham special? It was that he responded to God in faith. Abraham did not become the father of Israel by his own achievement, but by God's grace. Abraham simply took God at his word. This, for Paul, is not a "work". It is an act of the will; a free acceptance of what God offers. Each new generation is called to renew that acceptance, to be open to receive God's grace.

John 3 1-17 To enter the kingdom of God is the greatest thing that can happen to us. It is a new birth under the unseen, renewing power of God, something that comes to us entirely from outside. The only way to this new birth is by believing in Jesus. Through him God is working to save the world. This belief is the same faith that Abram/Abraham showed. By responding in faith, we let God act in our lives, we make room for his grace.

Points for prayer

- Is there space for God's grace to work in my life?
- What are my fears and anxieties? Can God keep me through them?
- What is God calling me to do? Am I ready to respond in faith?
- Pray for those who do not seem to find God's loving presence with them.

An Invitation to an Iftar Up to 8 members of Holy Trinity have been invited with other Christians in Ixelles to an Iftar (the evening breaking of the Ramadan fast) by the Mosque at rue Malibran 72. On Saturday 25 March. This Iftar starts at 19h, preceded by an optional visit to the mosque at 17h30 (gathering at 17h). We gather at 5 pm but the visit to the mosque is optional, so people can join at 6:45 pm if they prefer. Participation is for free but a contribution for the victims of the earthquakes in Turkey and in Syria is suggested. This is a great opportunity to grow in our understanding of Islam and of our Muslim neighbours. Please let John Wilkinson know, as soon as possible, if you would like to come. Numbers are limited.

A note from the Treasurer. It's probably surprising to learn that it costs over €1,000 per day to run Holy Trinity. The majority of our income comes from the gifts and donations made to The Friends of Holy Trinity via our bank account BE67 1030 7048 2187. This is the most cost-effective way to give to the church as each transaction costs typically 4 cents. This means that the church receives €99.96 for each donation of €100. It would still be reasonable at €99.93 by Payconia but SumUp would give us €98, Stripe €96 and Givt €93 for each €100 donated. Cash would be expected to net €99.70 for each €100 donated due to the time required to count and bank the cash and the risk of loss or theft. Therefore, we encourage standing orders via the bank. The budget for this year shows a shortfall of €27,500 in income to meet the expected expenses. Therefore, I am asking everyone to prayerfully consider their giving to see if there is room to increase the amount given to the church despite the increase in costs that we all face in our daily lives.
