Remembrance 12 November 2023

Our readings this week

In our approach to the Advent season, we are urged to be prepared for the day of the Lord's return. The core of that preparation is to be found in the way in which we live.

Amos 5:18-24 Amos is concerned with the corruption and evil in high places that is destroying Israel. In the present situation, the day of the Lord will be a day of reckoning, not of rescue. He urges reform, with justice and righteousness as the marks of the kingdom. That is the key to a good relationship with God.

Psalm 70 The king needs God's help as his enemies close in, thinking to have him in their grasp. But he trusts in the God who reverses earthly certainties. The day of the Lord may seem delayed, but it will come. Those who love God long for it. O Lord do not delay, they pray. Our prayer is "Come, Lord Jesus".

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 Many people today believe that death is the end. Sadly, that means that they must die without hope. Christians, on the other hand, both live and die in hope of the day when the Lord will come and take us all to be with him forever.

Matthew 25:1-13 Jesus here looks forward to the day of the Lord. In his parable, the bridesmaids know that the bridegroom will arrive, but they do not know when. Likewise, we know that one day the Lord will come, although we do not know when. As the bridesmaids must be prepared for the bride, so we must be ready for the Lord. Jesus is calling on us to put our lives in order now, while there is time. Then we can live in hope and expectation of his coming.

Pointers for prayer

- The day of the Lord is not to be taken lightly. But through it comes hope. Pray for the hopeless of the earth
- Pray for the church to live in expectation of the Lord's return with room in their hearts for him
- Am I living prepared for the coming of the Lord?
