2 Chronicles 24:20-22 The way of the world is one of wandering. In this case, the death of an old and respected high priest, who had inspired and guided the king and people, is followed by loss of direction. When the new high priest speaks out against corruption, he is undermined and killed, along with his son. But the son's dying words remind us all that, however high we be, we must account for our actions before God.

Psalm 119 161-168 Everyone faces choices as to the path they follow in life. Those who put their trust in God and his word find great peace there. Although they may be persecuted for their faith, it is to God that they look for salvation. For them, it is a choice between truth and falsehood. They tremble in awe before God's word, rather than trembling in fear at the threats of human opponents.

Acts 7:51-end People do not like being confronted with the truth, if they feel that it condemns them. By his words, Stephen provoked the fury of the mob. But it was the vision of Christ in glory, rather than the mob, that moved him. His death seemed like a terrible defeat for the young church. But Acts shows us how that moment of crisis led to a transformation of the preaching of the gospel. This was not to be a defeat, but a turning point.

Matthew 10:17-22 From his first instructions to his disciples, Jesus warned that the preaching of the gospel would provoke furious opposition. Yet he urges the disciples to be fearless and to trust God for guidance. His own preaching showed both the opposition that the gospel meets and the faith that confronts evil. We can expect no better than our Lord. But God vindicated him.

Pointers for prayer

- As we celebrate Christmas, Christ's church is reminded that its calling is to proclaim a gospel that is not about tinsel, but about truth and justice.
- Does my own life show the Christmas message of fearlessness and reconciliation with God?
- Pray for the many persecuted Christians in the world, to know God's vindication.

The following measures are in place to keep us COVID-safe in church:
