Our readings this week

Exodus 24: 12-end Moses is called up onto the mountain to receive the law, leaving the people below. His encounter with God is described in classic Old Testament terms: God is present in a cloud and his glory seems to the watchers below to be like a devouring fire. This is a key moment in the history of Israel.

Psalm 2 This psalm may well have been used at the coronation of the king. But it is also messianic, for the king is referred to as the Lord's "anointed". Its theme is a warning to the self-important peoples and rulers of the world to recognise that our king stands far above them in precedence. Our king is also the anointed one of the Lord, and God acts for and through him. When they understand who he really is, they should know with what respect to treat him.

2 Peter 1:16-end Peter is clear that the Christian gospel, which he commends to God's people, is firmly attested to by both the eyewitness testimony of those who were with Jesus, and the prophetic voice of scripture. Remembering that prophecy is more often about speaking forth God's truth than foretelling events across time, we see how the gospel is embedded in lived experience: both that of the church's first leaders and that which Israel testifies to. The church has sprung from such experience.

Matthew 17: 1-9 Three of the gospels recount this event shortly after Peter's confession of Jesus. In it, Peter, James and John are allowed to witness the intimate relationship between Jesus, his Father and the Old Testament tradition represented by Moses and Elijah. To eyes that were looking on Jesus in faith came the visionary experience of just how special he was. True faith sees the continuity of God's involvement with his people.

Pointers for prayer

- Is my own experience building on the firm foundation of the continuous experience of God's people?
- When we look on Jesus with the eyes of faith, we may behold things far greater than we ever expect;
- Pray that our lives may reflect some of the glory of Jesus into the lives of others.

A note from the Treasurer. It's probably surprising to learn that it costs over $\leq 1,000$ per day to run Holy Trinity. The majority of our income comes from the gifts and donations made to The Friends of Holy Trinity via our bank account BE67 1030 7048 2187. This is the most cost-effective way to give to the church as each transaction costs typically 4 cents. This means that the church receives ≤ 99.96 for each donation of ≤ 100 . It would still be reasonable at ≤ 99.93 by Payconiq but SumUp would give us ≤ 98 , Stripe ≤ 96 and Givt ≤ 93 for each ≤ 100 donated. Cash would be expected to net ≤ 99.70 for each ≤ 100 donated due to the time required to count and bank the cash and the risk of loss or theft. Therefore, we encourage standing orders via the bank. The budget for this year shows a shortfall of $\leq 27,500$ in income to meet the expected expenses. Therefore, I am asking everyone to prayerfully consider their giving to see if there is room to increase the amount given to the church despite the increase in costs that we all face in our daily lives.
