Our readings this week

1 Kings 19:9-18 It is when Elijah is deepest in his despair that he suddenly, unexpectedly, encounters God, not in a mighty voice or in spectacular events, but in the still voice that speaks quietly to his conscience. What are you doing here, Elijah? Get about my business. Often, we are looking so eagerly for the spectacular act that we miss the quiet transformation that God is working.

Psalm 85:8-13This is a psalm of longing and of listening. If we express our longings to God, we should expect his answer. To hear that answer, we must be listening. And indeed, God's love and faithfulness, righteousness and peace stand ready, together and in full cooperation, to work his blessing among his people. As the psalmist prayed for the whole land of Israel, so our longings should be for the whole church.

Romans 10:5-15 God's word is very near to us if we will only listen to it. When we place our trust in that word, it will show, whether outwardly or inwardly. It is that response of faith that is the key, not our origins, or some heroic action. But what we have received must be passed on, for otherwise how can other people know of God's salvation? Passing on the faith itself gives expression to our faith.

Matthew 14:22-33 When Christians are despairing and fearful, toiling in the darkest hour, then is the moment when Jesus comes and says *Do not be afraid*. Peter, and the disciples in the boat, give us a picture of the value of the church. In their company we are secure, however troubled the boat may be. If we are called to act alone, it is vital that our attention should not wander from Jesus.

Pointers for prayer

- Lay out your anxieties before God. Like Elijah, be persistent: do it again
- Are we listening? Pray for ears alert to God's voice
- Pray for all those who feel that their faith is under attack
- Jesus comes to his disciples when they are on the task to which he has directed them
- Pray for God's love and faithfulness, righteousness and peace to be seen, working in the whole church.
