Our readings this week

As Israel was chosen to be a channel of blessing to the whole world, so the church must be: passing on the good news of Christ.

Isaiah 56:1, 6-8 Some in the church seem to have felt that the blessings of God were for them alone, while others have felt that they were not qualified for his gifts. Isaiah's words remind us of Jesus' proclamation of the kingdom of God and of his use of verse 7 when he cleansed the temple. God's blessing is for all who wholeheartedly serve him. He does not maintain those divisions between insiders and outsiders which have so often limited the love shown by the church.

Psalm 133 This psalm is a little jewel that honours family unity through two pictures. Unity gives a gleam to the family, as oil poured on the head and rubbed in sooths dry cracked skin and brings dusty hair under control, softening it and making the hair and face gleam. And it is like the mountain dew that falls unseen, bringing refreshment to a parched land. So God's blessing refreshes and restores the family that is united, enabling it to shine.

Matthew 15:10-28 We are not used to Jesus speaking harshly. But this incident was important for the evangelist, for it shows that Jesus will respond to faith, wherever it is found. It warns the church against rejecting those who may not fit with its immediate plans. It also displays a model for persistent prayer.

Pointers for prayer

- Worship and blessing depend on each other. If we want to experience blessing, we must worship. If we have been blessed, we must respond with worship.
- Salvation is not a private gift, but one for the whole world. How can we pass it on?
- If we have serious needs, the Bible urges us to be persistent in our prayers.
- Give thanks for the blessing we have received through the Jewish people.
