No Wednesday services until September

Our readings this week

Isaiah 51:1-6 Look back to your foundations, says the prophet. Abraham heard God's call and responded in faith, acting in the expectation that God would fulfill his covenant. God's people must listen and have faith in God's promise that he will again bless his people. Then they are to look forward, to what God will do for the world through them. God's people must see themselves in the light of God's salvation of the world. They are called to build on the rock of faith, like Abraham.

Psalm 124 This is the song of a people saved, against all the odds, from the seeming certainty of destruction. The picture of a roaring flood carrying all before it is used for the violent and seemingly unstoppable assault of the enemy. The people are like a helpless bird, trapped in a net, expecting only to have its neck wrung. Yet suddenly they are free! What has happened? The Lord has come to the aid of his people, the Lord who made heaven and earth and rules over all.

Romans 12:1-8 Paul points us to a church in which everyone responds to God's salvation by giving themselves completely to him. Paul uses this picture of Christians as parts of one body here and elsewhere. Each has a role to play, each is indispensable to the whole, all depend on Christ. He uses this to show us ourselves in a new light, as members of a community in which each has their own value, their own particular service. This service is a working out of our faith, making us an active and effective body of Christ.

Matthew 16:13-20 Peter's confession is the climax of the first half of the gospel. Who or what is the rock on which Jesus will build his church? Is it every disciple who confesses Jesus? Is it Jesus, recognized as the Christ? Or is it Peter? Certainly, Peter brings these points together. And he later uses the keys to unlock the kingdom to the gentiles.

Pointers for prayer

- Are we allowing for the possibility that God is at work?
- How can I serve in the community of servants?
- Have we brought our problems to the God who is our help?
- Praise the God who stoops to save us in Jesus and confess him!
