Our readings this week

Jeremiah 4:11-12, 22-28 The theme of these verses is God's judgment on Jerusalem and Israel. Judgment is a consequence of the evil folly of the people. It is pictured as a hot wind blowing from the desert and destroying all in its path. The second picture, of the land after judgment, is of a lifeless desert, of ruins devoid of people. But although judgment must come, there is a hint that a remnant will survive.

Psalm 14 Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, but to deceive oneself into thinking that God does not notice what we are up to is folly. Many fall into this trap, becoming corrupt, pursuing dishonest profit, devouring God's people. A salutary shock awaits them when they will find themselves confronted by God.

1Timothy 1:12-17 Paul started as a violent opponent of the church. But the grace and love of Jesus changed him. Paul is convinced that Jesus wants to change all of us so that we can enjoy the love of God. He is an example for others to learn from, not least in the praise he gives God for his salvation.

Luke 15:1-10 Jesus saw himself as gathering in the lost sheep of Israel. Like the widow hunting for her lost coin, he will not give up until he succeeds. "Good" people tend to think of themselves as part of the ninety-nine. But the rejoicing in heaven is over the one, not over the ninety-nine. Where is our focus as a church?

Pointers for prayer

- Messing up is part of being human. Having a loving God, who
 accepts true repentance, is part of the privilege of being a
 Christian. I must not hesitate to come before God with a
 repentant heart, seeking his forgiveness for my failures;
- Who is praying for forgiveness for the mistakes of the states and nations, the churches and the communities from which we come? It is a task for us;
- It is when we follow Jesus by reaching out to the lost and needy that his church can share fully in the joy of heaven. When I realize that he reaches even me, heaven's joy becomes my praise.

Following up from the 'Living with Loss' that was a joint interactive talk facilitated by Sonja Stark of St. Paul's Tervuren and Rose Omondi of HTB,

we would like to offer a 6-week bereavement support

group for those who have recently lost loved ones and are going through a period of grief. We would limit this to a small group of a maximum of 10 and expect them to commit to all the six sessions. We plan to have:

- the first meeting 'in person' on Saturday 8 October from 10 12 at Holy Trinity Church House,
- then have online sessions once a week for five other weeks on Oct 12, Oct 19, Oct 26; Nov 9, Nov 16 all from 20:00 to 21:15.
- We could then offer a final in-person meeting on Saturday 19th November at the Holy Trinity church house from 10-12 for a chance to wish each other well and see each other in person once again.

Starting from October, HTB and Christian Climate Action will be offering a **'Deep Waters'** course. This is an 8-week programme which provides a faith-based framework for exploring issues of anxiety, fear and grief linked to the climate and environmental crisis. Deep Waters supports reflection and conversation with others trying to make sense of climate grief and eco-anxiety through eyes of faith. The journey takes us through themes including lament, truth, wisdom, mortality and justice, in pursuit of renewed hope. The course will run on Tuesday evenings from 4th October, with a mix of 'live' meetings (at HTB) and online sessions.
