Our readings this week

Jeremiah 8:18-9:1 This is a lament for Jerusalem, the city under judgment. Who is the speaker? At times it seems to be the city herself, at others the prophet speaking on her behalf. It seems that not just the king, but God himself has forsaken the city. The harvest has been lost, there is no healing balm for the city's wound. Some of the words might even be uttered by God, in grief at what the city has brought upon itself.

Psalm 79:1-9 This is a lament for Jerusalem, laid waste by its enemies, its sacred places defiled. Not just the city, but its people have been given over to destruction. Not only are the survivors mocked by their neighbours: worse, they have the sense that God's anger has been turned upon them. It is from there that they cry for help. "How long, O Lord?"

1 Timothy 2:1-7 It is easy for Christians to become so preoccupied with their own needs that they forget that they are part of a world for which Jesus has given himself. Christians should be in prayer for everyone. Whether or not we like those in high political office, we should pray for them. Praying for others will have consequences for us all.

Luke 16:1-13 This point of this story of Jesus is not easy to grasp. Perhaps we do best to look at its context. Jesus is being eagerly listened to by social outcasts, but the religious seem only able to find fault. Then the story seems to say: look, you know how to be worldly-wise when it comes to your business manoeuvres; how come you are not smart when it comes to the things of God? Then he reminds them: you cannot serve God and wealth. Which is more important to them?

Pointers for prayer

- •Think over the importance that we attach to our material well-being and the importance that we attach to God. Should we change the balance?
- Take time to pray for those people in authority that you find least appealing.
- Give thanks that, high above the deceptions, trickeries and injustices of this world is an all-seeing God, who is righteous.

Following up from the 'Living with Loss' that was a joint interactive talk facilitated by Sonja Stark of St. Paul's Tervuren and Rose Omondi of HTB,

we would like to offer a 6-week bereavement support

group for those who have recently lost loved ones and are going through a period of grief. We would limit this to a small group of a maximum of 10 and expect them to commit to all the six sessions. We plan to have:

- the first meeting 'in person' on Saturday 8 October from 10 12 at Holy Trinity Church House,
- then have online sessions once a week for five other weeks on Oct 12, Oct 19, Oct 26; Nov 9, Nov 16 all from 20:00 to 21:15.
- We could then offer a final in-person meeting on Saturday 19th November at the Holy Trinity church house from 10-12 for a chance to wish each other well and see each other in person once again.

Starting from October, HTB and Christian Climate Action will be offering a **'Deep Waters'** course. This is an 8-week programme which provides a faith-based framework for exploring issues of anxiety, fear and grief linked to the climate and environmental crisis. Deep Waters supports reflection and conversation with others trying to make sense of climate grief and eco-anxiety through eyes of faith. The journey takes us through themes including lament, truth, wisdom, mortality and justice, in pursuit of renewed hope. The course will run on Tuesday evenings from 4th October, with a mix of 'live' meetings (at HTB) and online sessions.
