Our readings this week

Genesis 50:15-21 Joseph's brothers had plenty to feel guilty about. Now that their father is out of the way, would Joseph work a terrible revenge on them? Joseph shows the greatness of spirit to be able to see beyond the evil deed to the good that God had brought through it. His trust in God enables him to rise above personal revenge and makes him a model of the forgiveness that Christ urges on us all.

Psalm 103:1-7, 8-13 This is a hymn of praise to God, both for who he is and for what he does for his people. Towards his people he expresses love: forgiveness, redemption, satisfaction of our needs. If he works for justice, it is not just through accusation, but through mercy and loving kindness. Our compassionate God understands our human weakness. Unlike our human frailty and transience, his love towards those who respond to him is everlasting.

Romans 14:1-12 Paul pleads with Jewish and Gentile Christians to understand and to embrace each other. He knows how easy it is for Christians to be distracted from living out the Christian life by finding fault with the faith of others. But the Christian life is about following Jesus, not about finding fault with other Christians. Time has made the issues he refers to look trivial enough to us. Does this have anything to say about the sometimes furious dissensions of our own day?

Matthew 18:21-35 The God who is willing to put everything else aside to recover lost souls does not want quarrelsome people to make obstacles to this reconciling work. The parable reminds us that we do not live only on the level of relationships with other humans. We are also in relationship with God. What we do towards others and our relationship with God are inseparably bound together.

Pointers for prayer

- Give thanks for the grace of God which reaches into my weakness.
- Pray the Lord's prayer, remembering that its petition for forgiveness is conditional on what we do towards those who may offend us;
- How open is our church community to embracing all those who feel cut off from the love of God?

Do come and join us downstairs and introduce yourself if you are new or visiting Brussels.

The Bishop of London, the Right Reverend Sarah Mullally will be with us in Brussels from 13th until 15th October. Before her ordination she was Chief Nursing Officer of England and was originally invited to visit us soon after her appointment as Bishop because of the Edith Cavell link. Her visit now comes at a good time because she is patron of Holy Trinity, which means that she has an important role in the appointment of a new senior chaplain. This visit will give her the opportunity to get to know us!

A note from the Treasurer As we move towards the final quarter of the year, I would like to give you an update on the state of our finances. Our cost budget this year is €1,035 per day. With Paul's departure and other cost savings, our costs are expected to be about €992 per day. Your giving, for which we are very grateful, amounts to €818 per day. We have found other sources of income which add another €160 per day to make a total income of €978 per day. This leaves a shortfall of €14 per day which may not sound much but over the course of the year its over €5,100. The challenge for us is to bridge this gap. Can we do it?

John Wilkinson writes: A big thank you to everyone for their support and prayers over the last five weeks since my operation. The operation was a success. Although you will be seeing more of me over the coming days and weeks, I am still recovering towards full strength, and will be following the advice of many to be careful about returning fully to work too soon!
