Our readings this week

Jeremiah 32:1-3a, 6-15 The nation is under imminent threat. Jeremiah has been shut up as a threat to royal policy. Yet the word of prophecy is something quite unexpected. By going through all the formalities, paying the price and taking formal possession of a new field, Jeremiah shows his trust that God will continue to protect his people in the land he has given them.

Psalm 91:1-6, 14-16 There is here a profound expression of trust in God's care for his faithful people, of its protection of those who love him, who know his name and call upon it. In the background may be a powerful threat. Then we may read these words as an exhortation to trust in the most unpromising circumstances. To read it literally would be naïve – Jesus himself rejected such a reading of verses 11-12.

1 Timothy 6:6-19 The Christian is warned against the love of money, which can lead to temptation and ruin and distracts people from the faith. Far better to focus on being content with enough and on being godly. Riches are uncertain friends, while a life of faith is reflected in doing good and receives the promise of true riches in the eternal life that we saw in Jesus.

Luke 16:19-end The rich man is so complacent in his wealth that he does not even notice the poor man at his gate, nor does he think on the opportunities that his wealth offers. But after death the roles are reversed. Now his wealth cannot help him and it is too late to repent. Should he have known better? The law and the prophets challenge the wealthy. We are still better informed, for we know of one who came back from the dead. His warnings against trusting wealth could hardly be clearer.

Pointers for prayer

- •God calls me to evaluate my life: where do I place my trust? If I lay my values before God, he will help me see more clearly;
- •Pray that we may be content with enough, and to be able to use what God gives us in his service;
- •We know what type of people God is most concerned for. Pray for them.

Following up from the 'Living with Loss' that was a joint interactive talk facilitated by Sonja Stark of St. Paul's Tervuren and Rose Omondi of HTB,

we would like to offer a 6-week bereavement support

group for those who have recently lost loved ones and are going through a period of grief. We would limit this to a small group of a maximum of 10 and expect them to commit to all the six sessions. We plan to have:

- the first meeting 'in person' on Saturday 8 October from 10 12 at Holy Trinity Church House,

'Deep Waters' course. This is an 8-week programme which provides a faith-based framework for exploring issues of anxiety, fear and grief linked to the climate and environmental crisis.
