# Our readings this week

**Jeremiah 11:18-20** Jeremiah encountered ferocious opposition among his own people. But he was committed to the Lord's work, whatever the personal cost. He could describe himself as being led like a lamb to the slaughter. Why did he accept this? Because he put his trust in God, not in men and women.

**Psalm 54** The psalmist is beset by godless people. Where is he to look for help? He has no hesitation. Unlike his assailants, he trusts in God and so it is to him that he prays. He is confident of God's faithfulness. It is that confidence which enables him to move from the opening cry of the psalm to the assured declaration of deliverance with which it closes.

James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a James contrasts the wisdom of the world, with its ambition and self-seeking, with the wisdom of God that is marked by peacefulness, submission, mercy and service. These rival claims battle for mastery over us. But James has a beautiful promise in verse 8a: if we draw near to God, he will draw near to us. We are not left alone when we struggle against evil, and the victory is God's.

Mark 9:30-37 Three times, in chapters 8, 9 and 10, Jesus predicts his death. Each time, the disciples fail to understand. Instead, they look to the coming kingdom as bringing worldly success. But such personal ambition should have no place among disciples of Jesus and neither should rivalries between his followers. Rather, Jesus reminds his disciples that we are called to the service of others, even of people who may seem to us to be totally insignificant. In serving them, we will find that we are serving God himself.

#### **Pointers for prayer**

- What are we looking for from God? Is it a "successful" life, with a comfortable solution for all our problems, or is it to be allowed to be of service to him?
- Pray for help to distinguish between worldly wisdom and the wisdom that is of God – and for grace to live accordingly;
- Pray for all those who stand for God in the face of the world's scorn and opposition, that they may experience his deliverance.
