Our readings this week

Genesis 28:11-18 Jacob, used to living by his wits finds, when he is alone and vulnerable, that he is in the house of God. It is God's election and his rich promises, not his trickery, that will bring him real blessing. It was the same for Abraham and of Isaac. How unlikely it must have seemed that those rich promises could be fulfilled. Yet God's agents are at work, doing his bidding on earth. or

Revelation 21:9-14 The Tempter claimed to be able to give Jesus the kingdoms of the world with their glory. Now, in a passage full of Old Testament reference, John sees the true glory of the city of God, built to symbolic proportions with twelve gates for the twelve tribes and raised on the foundations of the twelve apostles. This is the eternal city of God's elect. To its glory, the Tempter has no claim. This is the bride of Christ.

Psalm 122 The theme of this famous Song of Ascents is the joyful march of God's pilgrim people to their meeting with him in the city of God, the place of judgement, truth, fair dealing and justice. Theirs is not a solitary pilgrimage: God's people go together to meet him. The peace of Jerusalem is a joy to be shared by the whole community of those who love God. That is something that makes them special.

1 Peter 2:1-10 Peter exhorts the believers to feed on true spiritual nourishment, so as to grow towards maturity. The community of believers is built on the risen Lord. While the unbeliever finds him a shocking challenge and stumbles, to the new community of believers he is the foundation of a wholly new spiritual edifice, in which the new community inherits God's promises to Israel.

John 10:22-29 Jesus uses the picture of the good shepherd who calls to his sheep. We can debate endlessly about whether or not to respond to that call, but it is not to clever argument that he calls us. Rather, we are called to the decision of faith. Those who respond find that he leads them to rich pastures and to security. They will experience God at work in their lives and find eternal life. Others may reject him, even doing so with violence. The decision rests with us.

Pointers for prayer

- Think on the promises offered to us by God in Jesus and compare them with the promises of this world;
- Pray for grace in any situation where we find it difficult to distinguish what is true from what is false;
- Pray for God's pilgrim people in all the challenges they face;
- Thank God for his providence for his people.

The flowers today are offered to the Glory of God, in honour of St Francis of Assisi and his love of Creation.
