Our readings this week

Exodus 32:1-14 What is going on in this striking story? Perhaps it is not so much a conscious rejection of Yahweh (see verse 5) as the replacement of his self-revelation with Israel's own idea of what he should be like. Moses pleads with God, is angry towards the betrayers, tries to understand what has happened, punishes the betrayers and then again pleads with God. God first shows anger, then pity. But we have yet to hear of God's final reaction.

Psalm 106:1-6, 19-23 The psalm is built around Israel's recollection of the Exodus experience. Despite God's mighty works on their behalf, Israel repeatedly turned away from the God who saved them. Was Israel ready to exchange that gloriously free and powerful God for the lifeless image of an animal because they thought they could control it? The picture of Moses standing in the breach, interceding before the God of steadfast love, is one to hold on to.

Philippians 4:1-9 The disagreements between two leaders of the Philippi church – both, as it happens, women - are thought by many commentators to have provided the occasion for Paul's letter. But Paul's emphasis is on the need for his beloved community to focus on those good things listed in verse 8 which, through the spirit of prayer and praise which they engender, will lead to peace. Perhaps most memorable among the many exhortations of these lovely verses is the twice-repeated exhortation to rejoice.

Matthew 22:1-14 The parable of the wedding banquet contrasts those long-invited, but who fail to respond when the time comes; and those whom many would consider unworthy, but who end up attending the banquet. The fate of the one without the wedding garment may remind us that, although our invitation to God's banquet may flow from his grace and mercy, yet he expects righteousness of his guests.

Pointers for Prayer

- Am I living my life in response to the God who saves, or am I putting my own longings and imaginings in his place?
- Pray that our behaviour will draw people towards Jesus, not turn them away;
- Thank God for his enduring love and for Jesus Christ our intercessor with him.

A note from the Treasurer As we move towards the final quarter of the year, I would like to give you an update on the state of our finances. Our cost budget this year is €1,035 per day. With Paul's departure and other cost savings, our costs are expected to be about €992 per day. Your giving, for which we are very grateful, amounts to €818 per day. We have found other sources of income which add another €160 per day to make a total income of €978 per day. This leaves a shortfall of €14 per day which may not sound much but over the course of the year its over €5,100. The challenge for us is to bridge this gap. Can we do it?

Holy Trinity's former senior chaplain, Paul Vrolijk, has published a personal memoir entitled **Farewell to my father** about the death of his father and the immediate aftermath. It is a hopeful book about faith, the ups and downs of life, God's love and faithfulness, and the love of a family and of a village community.
