Our readings this week

Habakkuk 2:1-4 Judah seems trapped between corrupt politics at home, the standing menace of Assyria and the new threat of Babylon. Habakkuk remains open to God's vision. His refusal to abandon hope is vindicated in the conviction that God hears his cry. God is still in control, even if appearances suggest otherwise. Justice will triumph. In the meantime, God's people must hold to their faith in Him.

Psalm 31:1-6 These words are a great cry of distress. The king, beset by his enemies, turns to God as his helper. He seeks a refuge, a place of security where he will be safe from the traps laid by his enemies. While evil people serve the idols of their vanity, the king places his trust in God and seeks his guidance, his leading. It is God alone who is truly righteous, God who can save.

Ephesians 2:19-end This short passage uses three related pictures to describe the situation of the believer. First, along with all the saints, believers are citizens of the kingdom of God. The second picture goes farther: they are not just citizens, but members of the household of God, part of his personal entourage. The third goes yet further. Believers are part of the very fabric of the temple, God's dwelling place. God dwells in the believer: in you and in me. **John 20:24-29** While he discusses with the other disciples, Thomas places conditions on his belief. But when he encounters the risen Jesus, his conditions fall way in a glorious recognition of his Lord and God. The gospel reminds us that, even if we do not see the risen Lord, it is by putting our trust in Jesus that we will be truly blessed. His call to us is to put his words to the test: to live by them.

Pointers for prayer

- Meditate on the eternal strength of God and on the hope that flows from his love
- Pray for those who try to lead us in the now that is dwarfed by God's forever
- Before the twists and turns of political fortune, let us lay any anxieties, any sense of betrayal before the living God
