Our readings this week

Genesis 18:1-10a In the heat of the day, Abraham entertains strangers and finds that he has met with God. His attentiveness to his guests, his concern to welcome them, bring remarkable results, for the ancient promise to Abraham, the basis of his whole life, the promise of an heir, is astonishingly recalled with the news that the promise is now due and its delivery is imminent.

Psalm 15 This psalm reminds us most beautifully that the one who would rejoice in the hospitality of God should behave appropriately. The verses have a lovely and carefully constructed balance of action and attitude, words and deeds. It is not the behaviour that wins God's favour. Rather, the form of behaviour that is appropriate to being in God's presence gives life the deep stability that we crave.

Colossians 1:15-28 We must not underestimate Christ. This glorious passage hymns Christ for showing us God. Christ is supreme over the created order. More, he is the Lord of a new creation, the church, brought into being through his redemptive action on the cross, through which his people are reconciled to God. The concern of Colossians is that we should grasp the fullness of who Christ is and what he has done for us – and live accordingly.

Luke 10:38-end Earlier, Jesus has confirmed that the Christian life consists in loving God and loving one another. In the story of the Good Samaritan, we had the practical side of love. Now we are reminded of the need to show our love of God by listening attentively to his word. Martha's request may seem reasonable enough, but as so often when we feel sure how Jesus must answer, he replies quite differently. Jesus reminds us (here and elsewhere) of the danger of letting the cares of this life, even food, distract us from giving our full attention to the words of life.

Pointers for prayer

- How far does my behaviour match my wish to be close to God?
- If we would hear the news of God's promises and their fulfillment, we must listen carefully;
- Pray that Christ's church may show his full glory to the world.

A note from the Treasurer about the church finances

at the mid-year point: we are currently running a deficit, which is not a surprise, as our costs have gone up. However, there has been a decline in giving via bank transfers, what we call pledges, of almost $\{2,000\}$ per month compared to last year. Plate collections during services have picked up now that more of us are back in church but this has not compensated for the drop in pledges and leaves our total giving $\{2,000\}$ behind last year.
