Our readings this week

Genesis 18:20-32 In the sequence of stories about Abraham and his visitors, but outside the set passages, we find people who laugh. Sarah laughed because she could not believe in God's promise: Lot's sons-in-law could not imagine God's wrath. Today's passage is about prayer. Does it teach us that we can haggle with God? Or does Abraham find, by persistence in prayer, that he comes to understand both God's wrath and his love more clearly?

Psalm 138 If we pause to consider the gap between us and God, we will certainly ask ourselves why he should have any interest in lowly people like us. But the experience of the psalmist is that the God who sits in the court of heaven looks lovingly on lowly people and pours the good things of his providence on them. He answers our prayers. We should praise him.

Colossians 2:6-19 Trust in Christ is to be the core of the belief of the young church, and should not be distracted by human ideas. The reason is that in Christ we find the fullness of God in human form. His death and resurrection models the death of our old nature and our being made a new creation with him. Everything we need is in Christ, everything we need comes from Christ. Faith in Christ completely transforms our lives.

Luke 11:1-13 Jesus prayed and it is from his model that Christians build. The short, practical prayer that Jesus taught his disciples is strikingly simple and direct. The teaching that follows is designed to encourage us to be persistent and open with God. We are in a loving relationship with him and can be sure that he will respond with good things. If we have needs, if we need access to a closed place, if something is missing from our lives – ask. That was what Jesus did.

Pointers for prayer

- The reason we pray is that Jesus did. Are we doing it?
- If I have real issues in my life or about the world, have I taken them to God, in prayer?
- Praise the God who pours his gifts on those humble enough to ask.

A note from the Treasurer about the church finances

at the mid-year point: we are currently running a deficit, which is not a surprise, as our costs have gone up. However, there has been a decline in giving via bank transfers, what we call pledges, of almost €2,000 per month compared to last year. Plate collections during services have picked up now that more of us are back in church but this has not compensated for the drop in pledges and leaves our total giving €2,000 behind last year. The Treasurer encourages everyone to re-examine their giving to the church and, where possible, to make a standing order for their gifts to The Friends of Holy Trinity account BE67 1030 7048 2187.

Peace & Conflict transformation courses: The next series of courses (FR and EN) runs from October to April 2023 (45 hours for the first level: deep understanding of conflict - it's positive transformation and 30 hours for the second level: Tools of peacemakers and mediators). The English-speaking group will meet on Mondays (except the first Monday of the month) via Zoom from 19:00-22:00. The French speaking group will meet on Wednesdays via Zoom from 19:00-22:00. There will also be inperson courses on the second Saturday of the month at the church or a weekend away. If you would like to attend these courses, please register at this link.
