Our readings this week

Proverbs 8:1, 22-31 The Wisdom of God is presented in personal, feminine, terms as the architect or artisan of creation. Wisdom is the master-worker, at once delighted by creation and bringing delight through it. This provides a model that is developed in the New Testament's presentation of Jesus Christ.

Psalm 104:26-35 The is a hymn of praise to God as he reveals himself in creation. Notice how wisdom is tied up with this work, which embraces so many dimensions. All living things depend on their Maker to create, to sustain and to renew them and to provide a place for both their work and their play. This leads us to a sense of both joyful wonder and awe. How tragic if sin mars the glory of this work, detracting from the praise that it calls forth.

Colossians 1:15-20 This hymn to Christ praises him as the image of God, his firstborn and his agent in both creation and salvation. Thus, he is the head both of the created order and of the re-created order, represented by the church. The hymn puts Christ at the centre, as the focus of unity, fullness, reconciliation and peace. The characteristic that unifies all that he does is love.

John 1:1-14 Using "the Word" as a title for Jesus helps us understand how closely he is tied in to the very being of God, as the outward expression of what is innermost to God. He is the agent of creation and the source of the light and life on which it depends. But by entering his creation, he has revealed God's glory and its nature to us, created beings, from within the world of flesh in which we live, bringing it close.

Pointers for prayer

- How far does our enjoyment of God's wonderful creation respect it or mar it?
- Pray for all those to whom the creation seems hostile, who do not seem to find God's loving providence to meet their needs;
- Pray that the church may fulfil its role as the place where the new creation is to be found;
- Praise God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, for the wonder of all his works.

Update on Senior Chaplain Recruitment

Many thanks to the many people from all five of our services who participated in the survey about the recruitment of our new Senior Chaplain. The results have been analyzed to create drafts of the three key documents: Chaplaincy Profile, Role Description and Person Specification. The Church Council will review these drafts on Monday 5th February and after further editing approve the final versions at the formal Vacancy Meeting on Monday 5th March. Our patron, Bishop Sarah Mullally, our Diocesan Bishop Robert Innes and the mission director of the Intercontinental Church Society, Richard Bromley, all have important roles to play in the recruitment process. We will run advertisements in the Church Times and other media during April and we are setting up a rigorous selection process involving all the key partners. We have set Saturday 8th June as the date to interview final shortlisted candidates. We cannot yet predict the actual start date as this depends on factors outside of our control. The earliest possible date for the Licensing is October and it may be later in the year. We ask that you continue to hold this complex process in your prayers. Meanwhile if you have any questions or comments do contact the wardens, clergy or members of the Church Council.
