2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16 God dwells among us by his choice, not because we feel that it is appropriate that he should do so. There is a fine line between honouring God and feeling that he is in our power. God is always sovereign, always free, yet consistently chooses to care for us. How privileged we are to have a God who has chosen to care for us. **[The Magnificat** Mary rejoices in the way in which God overturns the familiar order, resetting it according to his lights. God is unimpressed by pride, worldly authority, or human riches. It is to the poor, the hungry, the humble that he comes. It is among them that he will find people willing to be his servants. Mary is the model for the class of people on whom God's mercy and blessing has fallen and will always fall.] or

[**Psalm 89** The fabric of this long song bears praise for God's goodness over many generations. If the covenant promise to David seems far from fulfilment, it is because of the failures of God's people. Yet to the eye of the poet, things seem to have gone too far. His cry *How long*, O *Lord*? conveys his deep longing for fulfilment. That note of longing was chosen to conclude the third book of psalms.]

Romans 16:25-27 Salvation has been brought to us by God's plan and power alone and is available to us and to all people through Jesus. It is not something that we could ever have earned, but it is graciously offered to us as a gift that we can make our own by accepting it with faith. The appropriate response is the praise of our hearts.

Luke 1:26-38 We need to be silent before this so-familiar story. God is about to fulfil his ancient promise. It will be his doing. But it needs human acceptance to become effective. Mary, though troubled, accepts so offering a model of Christian response to God that has shone down the ages.

Pointers for prayer

- Be still in amazement before God's action of love, and be open to it
- The world is full of people who desperately need God's love in their lives, but do not hear him, or cannot respond. The way we respond to God speaks to them, for good or for ill
- Meditate on Jesus, the wisdom of God, the Lord of his people, descendant of Jesse fulfilling long-standing promise, the key that opens the door of eternal life, God's fresh light for the world, the ruler of the nations: God with us.
