Our readings this week

Isaiah 61:10-62:3 This is a song of praise about the vindication of Jerusalem after all its troubles – the great theme of the closing chapters of Isaiah. Jerusalem praises God for his salvation and for the establishment of righteousness, a promise whose fulfilment will be seen by the nations of the world. Jerusalem stands for the people of God.

Psalm 148 This is a call to the whole created order to join in the praise of God, following traditional Jewish cosmology. It starts from the heavenly beings. Then it moves on into the created world of mountains and seas; the forces of nature, fire, hail, snow and frost; animals, birds and fish; then the human race from the highest to the lowest, of whatever age or gender. Why? Because God has acted to save his people.

Galatians 4:4-7 Paul reminds the Galatian Christians of just what the coming of Jesus means. Jesus, God's son, human, a Jew came to redeem us – to buy us back from slavery. The verses contrast the status of slaves, our former state, with that of being children of God. It is children, not slaves, who call their father Abba, the affectionate 'Dad'. As God's children, we are his heirs. What a change Jesus has brought!

Luke 2:15-21 These words are so familiar that we may need to struggle to let them speak to us. After the message from God, the shepherds head for Jerusalem to see the confirmation of what they have been told. This confirmation they duly find – the text does not explain how. But the shepherds tell others what they were told and what they saw. Like John the Baptist before him, Jesus is circumcised and named according to the practise of Jewish law.
