12:30 Holy Communion

Leading: John Wilkinson Preaching: Annie Bolger Those who worked to spread the gospel in the early church saw wonderful things happening. But they were quite clear that these things only happened because of the involvement of God.

Acts 8: 26-40 Christians see the Holy Spirit at work in Philip's apparently chance encounter with an Ethiopian official. The Ethiopian was searching; Philip was ready and willing to help; the Holy Spirit set up the situation and used it to spread the gospel far beyond Judaea.

Psalm 22 This psalm, which begins with such a cry of desolation and continues with an account of the deep suffering of God's servant, is one that we closely associate with Jesus and his agony on the cross. But we must not forget that the servant of God cries out in prayer and his prayer is heard. What begins in despair ends in the triumph of God himself – a triumph to be celebrated across the world and by generations yet unborn.

1 John 4:7-21 Love begins with God, but he directs it towards us in the person and work of Jesus, his son. If we open ourselves to Jesus, his love enters us. Then it shows in all our relationships, whether they are with God or other people. Love is, quite simply, the mark of the presence of God in the Christian.

John 15:1-8 The person who is closely connected to Jesus, and so to God, will live a life that bears fruit. What does Jesus mean by "fruit"? The other readings give us answers. Bringing love to others, or helping them understand the joy of the gospel, for example. Try as they might, the person who acts alone will fail, says Jesus. Cut off from God, they will wither and die.

Pointers for prayer

- Our lives change when we receive the love of God, given in Jesus. Am I really grafted in to Jesus?
- We serve a God of power. If we are responsive to his prompting, we will see wonderful things happening;
- When we see wonderful things happen, it is time to praise God.
 When we ask God to do wonderful things, it is time to expect them.

We're all inspired by our Pathfinders group helping to lead Holy Trinity over the next several months in theological lifestyle reflections. The first month's challenge is "What we wear: Explore sustainable fashion choices and the impact of our clothing habits." Maybe begin this month by learning more about <u>fast fashion</u> and the irreparable harm done by the fashion industry to people and planet. What steps could each of us take in the next month to disrupt our participation in fast fashion?

The Pathfinders suggest a challenge like <u>Project 333</u>, choosing to wear what we already have, 33 items over 3 months. These kinds of challenges can shift our perspectives on consumerism, materialism, and the connection between our clothing choices and the well-being of those around us!
