Our readings this week

Genesis 14:17-20 Abram acted to rescue Lot, captured during a raid between the petty kingdoms of the valley. Here we encounter Melchizedek, king and priest, seen in Psalm 110 and Hebrews as a type of Christ. 'God Most High', relatively rare, may be used by Gentiles of the true God. By his tithe to Melchizedek, Abram acknowledges that it is God who has given him victory. He remains untainted by Lot's association with the king of Sodom.

Psalm 128 The family which lives 'in fear of the LORD' will flourish, in a life at peace with others – where no-one robs the family of its produce – and with itself. The blessing is both figurative and literal. The literal blessing from Zion is a prayer for long life for the family, peace for the whole community and the prosperity of Jerusalem, God and his people together. The blessing of the family and the blessing of the whole people of God go together.

Revelation 19:6-10. The context of these verses is the defeat of Babylon, the enemy who had persecuted the church. Now follows the marriage of the Lamb – Jesus Christ – and his bride, made ready by her faithfulness. That justifies the 'white wedding'. The angel ensures that John will make clear to his readers, often persecuted, what a blessing it is to be invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb.

John 2:1-11 This lovely story is described as a "sign". What does it point to? Certainly, to abundant provision in place of shortage; and to the transformation of the water of the ceremonial law into the wine of Christ, wine that is sufficient for the needs of the whole world. Maybe it points to the great banquet at the marriage of the Lamb. The story is rich in meaning. The evangelist says it reveals Jesus' glory.

Pointers for prayer

- Pray for help to read well the signs that point to Christ;
- Pray that those are persecuted for their faith may be sustained by the promise that they will be guests at the marriage supper of the Lamb.
- Pray that all Christians may be united in faithfulness to Jesus Christ.

Meditative mending – Next time you have a hole in your clothing, a broken dish, or some other damaged item, consider mending it instead of throwing it away and buying something new. While it's tempting to think of throwing *away* as a final solution, 'away' is just that... shifting the problem elsewhere. Mending extends an item's use and can also be a meditative reflective process. Consider how God heals our brokenness and uses us despite our imperfections, as you darn your socks, sew on a button, or glue together a broken pot.
