Isaiah 60:1-6 This is literally a glorious vision. It describes the effect when God reveals himself to the world from among his people. It will be like great light shining in darkness, drawing people from all over the world, nations, rulers, even infants in arms. Those whose eyes are lifted enough to see what is happening will come bearing their gifts. **Psalm 72:1-15** This is a psalm sung for a king, a prayer that his reign may bring in all the rich blessings that come from God. They are worth enumerating. He is called to uphold justice, to care for the poor and the oppressed and to bring in the order of creation that enables a general growth of good things in the land. The psalm prays for his reign to be recognised in homage throughout the world, to bring a time of great and enduring blessing to all. It is God who is to be praised for all this!

Ephesians 3:1-12 God's truth is made known to the world through the gospel, of which we are all bearers. Paul saw clearly the boundless riches that God was making available to those who may have known nothing of him. He took seriously his own calling to help them lay hold of this wonderful gift. We do not just see the glory of God revealed. We are called on to share it.

Matthew 2:1-12 Wise men seeking the new ruler, follow the star, so nearly to disaster but finally to discovery of something quite different from what they must have expected. In their overwhelming joy they bow down in worship. Gratefully handing over the riches of the world, they depart, their lives engaged on a new path. Did ever a story so capture the minds of generations of hearers as this?

Pointers for prayer

- If we are to be able to glimpse the glory, we must be prepared to lift our eyes. Are we too focused on the dark corners of the world?
- Pray that the focus of our lives may point others to the rich gifts of God:
- Pause before the vision of glory. Then respond in worship.
