Our readings this week

Genesis 17:1-7, 15,16 Despite their great age, God promises Abraham and Sarah that they will found a great nation in the place where they now live as aliens. Normally, covenants impose equal obligations on both sides, but here the burden is on God. Abraham and Sarah have only to believe. As with all our covenants with God, this is a covenant of grace.

Psalm 22:23-31 The life of obedience to God is not always easy. At times of trouble, God may seem far away. Yet the psalm moves to a confident conclusion, for the psalmist is confident that God hears the cry for help from his own. It is with that certainty that he can face the future, looking to the time when God's rule is acknowledged. What a time of joy for those who put their trust in him.

Romans 4:13-25 Paul's point is that we lay hold of the benefits of the covenant by placing our faith in God, not through the sort of ceremonial obedience attached to practices such as circumcision. All those who put their trust in God, whether Jews or gentiles, can enjoy the benefits of God's covenant with Abraham, for when we are prepared to put our trust in God, he gives us credit for that and treats us as righteous.

Mark 8:31-38 Jesus is determined to obey God and to trust him right to the end. That is why he reacts so strongly to Peter. For us, a decision to follow Jesus is an act of the will. But it requires that we abandon self and trust God – as Abraham did. Jesus makes it plain that following him may not be easy, but will bring great rewards.

Pointers for prayer

- Pray that all those who are in pain or trouble may feel able to cry out to God: and that their cry may be heard, and they know God's strength;
- Which is the greater challenge to our faith: the pains of life; or the mockery of unbelievers? Pray for courage;
- Often those who most openly scorn commitment to God are nearer to faith than the indifferent. Pray for them, too.

Update on Senior Chaplain Recruitment

Many thanks to the many people from all five of our services who participated in the survey about the recruitment of our new Senior Chaplain. The results have been analyzed to create drafts of the three key documents: Chaplaincy Profile, Role Description and Person Specification. The Church Council will review these drafts on Monday 5th February and after further editing approve the final versions at the formal Vacancy Meeting on Monday 5th March. Our patron, Bishop Sarah Mullally, our Diocesan Bishop Robert Innes and the mission director of the Intercontinental Church Society, Richard Bromley, all have important roles to play in the recruitment process. We will run advertisements in the Church Times and other media during April and we are setting up a rigorous selection process involving all the key partners. We have set Saturday 8th June as the date to interview final shortlisted candidates. We cannot yet predict the actual start date as this depends on factors outside of our control. The earliest possible date for the Licensing is October and it may be later in the year. We ask that you continue to hold this complex process in your prayers. Meanwhile if you have any questions or comments do contact the wardens, clergy or members of the Church Council.
