12:30 Sister Julian's consecration

Preaching: Sister Julian

Exodus 20:1-17 To know the 10 commandments has become unfashionable. But we are the losers. For these simple but profound guidelines are for the benefit of those who would not live as slaves. The key is "no other Gods". But that leads on to so much else: the gift of the Sabbath; the family bond; and the ground rules that make it possible to live well with others.

Psalm 19 There are few who are not awestruck by a clear, starry night as it speaks of God's immensity, and of his creative power far beyond whatever he has allowed us to learn of it. So too God's law gives joy to the heart, light to the eyes, sweeter than honey. When did we have more need of a sure guide for living than today? Who would not want to give praise and obedience to such a God?

1 Corinthians 1:18-25 Those who mock the moral law also mock the cross, the power and the wisdom of God. There is a move across these verses as they speak of wisdom, from the wisdom of the wise, through the wisdom of the world, to God's wisdom: the wisdom that proclaims salvation to men and women through Christ crucified. We must not set human ideas above God: that is the first commandment.

Mark 12:28-34 Jesus' famous summary of the law first cites Deuteronomy, then adds words from Leviticus. His emphasis is on love: first, in the relationship between the disciple and God, as it were upand-down; and then in the relationship between the disciple and others, as it were to left-and-right. Maybe the whole of Christian theology is just a longer version of this cross-shaped picture.

Pointers for prayer

- Meditate on how obedience to the commandments can keep us from slavery;
- Some find the moral law a burden. Pray that they may discover its sweetness;
- Praise God that for all our failures and shortcomings as disciples are paid for in advance by Christ's once-for-all sacrifice.

Update on Senior Chaplain Recruitment

Many thanks to the many people from all five of our services who participated in the survey about the recruitment of our new Senior Chaplain. The results have been analyzed to create drafts of the three key documents: Chaplaincy Profile, Role Description and Person Specification. The Church Council will review these drafts on Monday 5th February and after further editing approve the final versions at the formal Vacancy Meeting on Monday 5th March. Our patron, Bishop Sarah Mullally, our Diocesan Bishop Robert Innes and the mission director of the Intercontinental Church Society, Richard Bromley, all have important roles to play in the recruitment process. We will run advertisements in the Church Times and other media during April and we are setting up a rigorous selection process involving all the key partners. We have set Saturday 8th June as the date to interview final shortlisted candidates. We cannot yet predict the actual start date as this depends on factors outside of our control. The earliest possible date for the Licensing is October and it may be later in the year. We ask that you continue to hold this complex process in your prayers. Meanwhile if you have any questions or comments do contact the wardens, clergy or members of the Church Council.

Our **Church Council** meeting will take place on **Monday**, **4 March** at 19:30 via Zoom. The first month's challenge is "What we wear: Explore sustainable fashion choices and the impact of our clothing habits." Maybe begin this month by learning more about <u>fast fashion</u> and the irreparable harm done by the fashion industry to people and planet. What steps could each of us take in the next month to disrupt our participation in fast fashion?

The Pathfinders suggest a challenge like <u>Project 333</u>, choosing to wear what we already have, 33 items over 3 months. These kinds of challenges can shift our perspectives on consumerism, materialism, and the connection between our clothing choices and the well-being of those around us!
