Our readings this week

Numbers 21:4-9 The desert journey was greatly prolonged because Israel would not enter the Promised Land from Kadesh. Now the Israelites are grumbling about God's miraculous provision for them, the food. Their ungratefulness leads them to suffer a plague of snakes. But they are rescued from the plague by the grace of God. Looking on the bronze serpent lifted up before them, they remember God's love for them and are saved.

Psalm 107:1-3, 17-22 Time and again Israel have found themselves in trouble, in the desert, in places of darkness, sick, exposed to the wild elements. The cause of these troubles was invariably their own folly. Yet their experience has always been that, when they cried to God, he transformed the situation by sending his word of power. They have reason for praise.

Ephesians 2:1-10 We must not forget the difference between where we are thanks to Christ Jesus and where we would have been on our own. By following our own desires we were dead, cut off from God. But because of his loving mercy, shown to us in Christ Jesus, we are saved, lifted up to sit with Christ in the heavenly places. All we have to do to lay hold of this gracious salvation is to accept it in faith.

John 3:14-21 When Jesus speaks of being "lifted up", his words speak both of his being exalted as king and lifted up on the cross. They point both to his glory and to the lengths to which God is willing to go, so great is his love for us. They confront us with a choice. Looking on the cross, do we respond to the exalted Saviour of the World, or do we ignore him? Our response is a choice between darkness and light and it judges us.

Pointers for Prayer

- The choices are set before us, lifted on high so that we cannot miss them. What do we choose?
- Pray that all those in trouble through their own folly may find and accept the love of Christ;
- Give thanks to God that at the root of our existence is his inextinguishable love for us.

Update on Senior Chaplain Recruitment

Key recruitment documents have been completed by the Church Council: Chaplaincy Profile, Role Description and Person Specification. Two lay vacancy representatives have been elected, Philippa Hayward and Ben Jance. Andrew Tank will serve as an observer.

We expect to advertise the post in April. Saturday 8th June is the date to interview final shortlisted candidates. We cannot yet predict the actual start date as this depends on factors outside of our control and the licensing date may be as late as 2025. We ask that you continue to hold this complex process in your prayers. Meanwhile if you have any questions or comments do contact the wardens, clergy or members of the Church Council.

Sights on Silver Campaign

We're all inspired by our Pathfinders group helping to lead Holy Trinity over the next several months in theological lifestyle reflections. The first month's challenge is "What we wear: Explore sustainable fashion choices and the impact of our clothing habits." Maybe begin this month by learning more about <u>fast fashion</u> and the irreparable harm done by the fashion industry to people and planet. What steps could each of us take in the next month to disrupt our participation in fast fashion?

The Pathfinders suggest a challenge like <u>Project 333</u>, choosing to wear what we already have, 33 items over 3 months. These kinds of challenges can shift our perspectives on consumerism, materialism, and the connection between our clothing choices and the well-being of those around us!
