Our readings this week

In Passiontide, we remember Jesus' last days in Jerusalem: what it involved; what was put at risk; and what was gained. It is a moment of judgement for us all.

Jeremiah 31:31-34 Much of Jeremiah is about the failure of God's people to keep their part of the covenant with God and the consequences that will follow. But now God promises a new covenant, to be marked by a special closeness and understanding, a covenant of forgiveness and of personal intimacy with God.

[Psalm 51:1-13 This act of confession, associated with David's adultery, provides a model for us all to use. It is a prayer about *my* sin, not someone else's, the waywardness that drags me away from God. He is holy and I am not. Sin is against God and it threatens my life-giving relationship with him – unless he will forgive me and recreate me. To achieve that, Jesus was willing to undergo the Passion.] **or**

[Psalm 119:9-16 How can we give young people a reliable guide to life? The poet, 2,500 years ago, shares his own experience. It is to guard his life with God's word. He treasures that word, meditates and fixes his eyes on it and declares it (to others). Twice, by way of emphasis, he recalls how he delights in it. What are his concerns? Not to stray, not to sin, not to forget God's word. He seeks God with his whole heart.]

Hebrews 5:5-10 It was no easy decision for Jesus to accept the cost of the Passion. After all, Jesus is human. But he is also God's own son and, when he obediently responds to God's call and all it brings, he acts as a high priest for us, quite differently from any human-ordained priest. He provides the bridge between God's holiness and sinful humanity, by which God works our salvation.

John 12:20-33 The critical moment in Jesus' work has come. It will be worked out over Easter. The gospel is in no doubt that Jesus knew well that at this moment he would have to stake his whole being in trust of God. But God approves: this act of commitment will see Satan driven out and a new king exalted.

Pointers for prayer

- We need to come humbly into Passiontide. If we are to receive, we need to recognise our need. Sin is first of all my problem;
- To receive forgiveness, I must offer it to others;
- As a sinner I can pray for others who, like me, find that their sins come between them and God;
- Jesus willingness to abandon his own life for us challenges every Christian.

Update on Senior Chaplain Recruitment

Sights on Silver Campaign

We're all inspired by our Pathfinders group helping to lead Holy Trinity over the next several months in theological lifestyle reflections. The first month's challenge is "What we wear: Explore sustainable fashion choices and the impact of our clothing habits." Maybe begin this month by learning more about <u>fast fashion</u> and the irreparable harm done by the fashion industry to people and planet. What steps could each of us take in the next month to disrupt our participation in fast fashion?

The Pathfinders suggest a challenge like <u>Project 333</u>, choosing to wear what we already have, 33 items over 3 months. These kinds of challenges can shift our perspectives on consumerism, materialism, and the connection between our clothing choices and the well-being of those around us!
