Racial Justice Sunday 11 February 2024

Our readings this week

2 Kings 2: 1-12 Elisha is fiercely loyal to Elijah, calling him his father. In Elijah he sees the source of strength and power needed by Israel. He is determined to stick with him to the end. But in the course of their journey together, Elisha comes to see that life, and God's work, must move on. By asking for a double-portion, he asks for the inheritance of the first-born son, showing his determination to continue the work that Elijah has begun.

Psalm 50 God reminds Israel that he is God, far above them, and their relationship must respect that difference. Israel seems to think that they can gain control of God through their sacrifices. But God does not need their sacrifices. What he wants is their heartfelt obedience to the covenant. Then, on the day of trouble, he will deliver them - and will welcome their thank offerings.

2 Corinthians 4: **3-6** Many people, dazzled by the attractions of material things, find the gospel obscure and full of difficulties. But once we have encountered Christ, it becomes very clear. It becomes a great source of inner light, lighting our path. Once we behold Christ's glory, we glimpse God himself and gain a perspective on everything else. The proclamation of that light is the task and purpose of the church.

Mark 9: 2-9 Jesus let his closest disciples experience a great moment of light, seeing him for who he really is, and hearing the voice of God. Peter does not want to let go of the moment. But by letting it go and setting out on the road to the cross, Jesus brought us salvation. Peter, like Elisha, came to understand this.

Pointers for prayer

- The starting point in our prayers, as in our lives, must be to humble ourselves before God and his holiness
- God seeks our true commitment to his service. Clinging to familiar securities and even to the high moments can be an obstacle to moving on in faith. What does that involve for me?
- The way we live out our Christian commitment is of enormous importance in a world which struggles to see the truth of the gospel.

Update on Senior Chaplain Recruitment

Many thanks to the many people from all five of our services who participated in the survey about the recruitment of our new Senior Chaplain. The results have been analyzed to create drafts of the three key documents: Chaplaincy Profile, Role Description and Person Specification. The Church Council will review these drafts on Monday 5th February and after further editing approve the final versions at the formal Vacancy Meeting on Monday 5th March. Our patron, Bishop Sarah Mullally, our Diocesan Bishop Robert Innes and the mission director of the Intercontinental Church Society, Richard Bromley, all have important roles to play in the recruitment process. We will run advertisements in the Church Times and other media during April and we are setting up a rigorous selection process involving all the key partners. We have set Saturday 8th June as the date to interview final shortlisted candidates. We cannot yet predict the actual start date as this depends on factors outside of our control. The earliest possible date for the Licensing is October and it may be later in the year. We ask that you continue to hold this complex process in your prayers. Meanwhile if you have any questions or comments do contact the wardens, clergy or members of the Church Council.
